The children were encouraged by play therapists to paint and draw images with the theme of 'My World'.
The competition is the brainchild of Truvo's Emma Walsh. She said the goal was to get as many children as possible involved.
"I think we underestimate the stress that these children are under when in hospital. "Children can be in for a long time, between coming in each out and hexise."

"Children ean be in for a long time, between coming in and out, and having chemotherapy treatment," said Emma.

"We brought the artists and art materials around to every single child in the hospital," Emma added.
"Children in wheelchairs and in their beds could paint and draw on boards, while others came to the playroom. All of the children who could, came down. came down.

"It was something all the children could do together, working towards the same goal.

"We chose the theme because it was along the lines of the theme of the environment."

The art lessons, one of which was carried out in Dublin's Hugh Lane Gallery, proved to be very popular and patients and visitors were all asked to interpret a theme.

The resulting images ranged from shoes and spacemen to pyjamas, haunted houses and families.

"While most of the children were bubbly and fun, some were quite low and sad," Emma said.
